Sir,

Sri Satya Sai University of Technology & Medical Sciences is functional since 2016 and has submitted an application for permission for sanction of 100 seats in BHMS course for the academic year 23-24, in which the entire functional profile has been narrated. The application has been examined by Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Homoeopathy as to whether the college fulfils the Minimum Standard Requirement to be fulfilled as per the prevailing regulations under NCH Act 2020 and conducted the Inspection of college on 21.08.2023 and 22.08.2023. Accordingly, it is to inform you that inspection reports submitted by inspectors, were examined by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board and following deficiencies were noticed:

1. The hospital is maintaining record in both ways-Manual and computerized, however, it is not completely computerized as the OPD card is being given to the patients in manual format.
2. The distribution of the patients in individual OPD were not properly done, because of which there were few discrepancies noted as compared to central OPD register.
3. There are four different OPD's as per MSR Pediatrics, Surgery, Gynae/Obs and Medicine. However, the doctor room was not spacious to accommodate patient and interns properly.
4. The pharmacy was visited where no central store was maintained for the medicines, also the dispensing register was showing few discrepancies. No proper indent/demand record was maintained in the pharmacy.
5. The pharmacist was not well aware about the stock, indent and demands of the pharmacy. The entries in the dispensing register was not properly done.
6. Clinical lab was established but only few test is being conducted in the insource lab, however, the hospital has MoU signed with the laboratory in the campus for the remaining tests to be conducted. The equipment were inspected, which were found functional during the visit.
